Sumptuous Scarf

designed by Susanna Shapiro



Yarn: Kathmandu Original, 180-190 yds, 200g: 3 skeins,
and Sari Ribbon, 50g : 1 hank for fringe
Needles: US sz 11 needles
Notions: yarn needle
Gauge: 2-2.5 sts = 1" (approx. 4 sts = 1" in pattern)
Measurements: 84" long, 10" wide at the center
Difficulty: Beginner

Scarf

Note: If you wish to combine the Original with the Sari Ribbon for the fringe, cut and measure your fringe *before* you begin knitting so you can be sure to have the correct amount. See fringe directions on reverse.

With Original, CO 30 sts.

Row 1: sl 1 purlwise, *k 1, p 1*, repeat from * to *, end k 1. Repeat Row 1 until you have the desired length or run out of yarn.

Bind off in pattern, weave in ends.

Fringe

With two strands of Original and one of Sari Ribbon, cut 16 bundles of fringe each approx. 14 inches long. One easy way to do this is to wrap a book or other item of appropriate size and cut open on one side.

Tie fringe on the first knit stitch and every other knit stitch.

About Sari Ribbon:

Remnant silk fabrics are cut into strips and sewn end to end to create this wildly unique yarn. The result is a chunky, shiny ribbon with a fabulous mix of colors.

The yarn is made for frabjous fibers by a group of women in India. By purchasing this yarn you're help to make fair trade work programs work!

Tips for working with recycled silk yarn:

- It is easier to work from a hand rolled ball
- As soon as you can, weave in your cast-on tail to keep it from catching on your working yarn.
- If your yarn is over-twisted, letting out some of the twist will make it easier to work with and maximize your yardage. The easiest way to do this is by putting a rubber band around your ball and dangling it (or your knitting, whichever is smaller at the time) allowing it to turn and untwist the working yarn.

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
